#### WEDNESDAY, 28 MAY, 1947.

- 1. OPENING OF PARLIAMENT:-The House met at Twelve o'clock at Noon, pursuant to a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the twenty-first day of May, 1947, of which a copy was read by Frederic Barker Langley, Esquire, the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, as follows:-
  - ( By His Excellency Lieutenaut-General Jour "NEW SOUTH WALES, NORTHCOTT, Companion of the Most Honourable to wit. Order of the Bath, Member of the Royal "(L.S.) Victorian Order, Governor of the State of New South Wales and its Dependencies, in the "J. NORTHCOTT. "Governor. Commonwealth of Australia.

"Is pursuance of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of the "State of New South Wales by virtue of an Act passed in the second year of "the reign of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, being 'An Act to "consolidate the Acts relating to the Constitution'. I do hereby proclaim that "a Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly for the State "of New South Wales for the despatch of business shall commence and be "holden on Wednesday, the twenty-cighth day of May, 1947, at 12 o'clock "noon, in the buildings known as the Legislative Council Chambers, in "Macquarie-street, in the City of Sydaey; and Members of the said Legislative "Council and Legislative Assembly, respectively, are hereby required to give "their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

"Given under my Hand and Seal, at Sydney, this twenty-first day of May, "in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty seven, "and in the eleventh year of His Majesty's Reign.

8. MESSAGE FROM THE COMMISSIONERS:---The Usher of the Black Rod being admitted, delivered a Message, that "The Commissioners request the hamediate attendance of this Honourable House, in the Legislative Council Chamber, to hear the Commission for Opening of Parliament read."

The House went, and the Members of both Houses being seated at the request of the President, on behalf of the Commissioners.-

The President said, ---

"Honourable Members of the Legislative Council, and Members of the Legislative "Assembly, -His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to cause a Commission "to be issued under the Great Seal of the State, constituting us Commissioners "to do on behalf of His Majesty, all things necessary to be done in the name "of His Majesty, or in the name of His Excellency the Governor of the State "in and about the opening and holding of this Parliament, to deliver a Message "to the Legislative Assembly, and to do all such other things as may be "specially necessary to enable Parliament to perform acts which educit of no "delay, as will more fully appear by the Commission itself, which must now "be read."

Whereupon the Commission was read by the Clerk of the Parliaments, as follows:—

"George the Sixth, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the "British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor "of India.

"To all to whom these presents shall come,-

"Greeting:

"WHEREAS by Proclamation made on the twenty-first day of May, 1947. His "Excellency, Lieutenant-General Joux NorthCort, Companion of our Most "Honourable Order of the Bath, Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Our "Governor of our State of New South Wales and its Dependencies, in the "Commonwealth of Australia, did in pursuance of the power and authority "vested in him as Governor of Our said State, by virtue of an Act passed in the "second year of the reign of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, being "an Act to consolidate the Acts relating to the Constitution," proclaim that "a Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly for the said "State should commence and be holden on Wednesday, the twenty-cighth day "of May, 1947, at the time and place mentioned in the said proclamation: "And whereas for certain causes our said. "all whom it concerns to meet in the said Parliament, that to the said ERNEST "HENRY FARMAR ROBERT REGISALD DOWNING and THOMAS STEELE, or any two "of them, they diligently attend in the premises in the form aforesaid."

"Witness Our Trusty and Well-beloved Lieutenant-General Jons "Nourneorr, Companion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, "Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Governor of Our State of "New South Wales and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of "Australia, at Sydney, in our said State, this twenty-sixth day of "May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand aine hundred and "forty-seven and in the eleventh year of Our Reign.

- 6. ELECTION OF SPEAKER: -Mr. Gorman, addressing himself to the Clerk (who, standing up, pointed to him, and then sat down), moved, That William Henry Lamb, Esquire, do take the Chair of this House as Speaker,--which motion was seconded by Mr. Roy Heferen.
  - And Mr. Lamb, standing in his place, informed the House that he accepted nomination.
  - Question, -That William Henry Lamb, Esquire, do take the Chair of this House as Speaker, -put by the Clerk and passed.
  - Whereupon Mr. Gorman and Mr. Heferen conducted Mr. Lamb to the Chair, where, standing on the upper step, he returned his acknowledgments to the House for the great honour they had been pleased to confer upon him,— And thereupon sat down in the Chair.
  - Mr. James McGirr, Mr. Treatt, Lieut.-Colonel Bruxner, Mr. Fitzgerald, Mr. Clyne and Mr. Jack Beale congratulated Mr. Speaker.

Mr. McGirr then informed the House that he had ascertained that His Excellency the Governor would receive their Speaker at Government House at three o'clock, pure, This Day.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair at Twenty-four minutes before Two o'clock, p.m., until Ten minutes before Three o'clock p.m.

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair at the hour named.

7. PRESENTATION OF SPLAKER:—The House then proceeded to Government House to present their Speaker to His Excellency the Governor,

And having returned. Mr. Speaker reported that the Assembly had been to Government House, where he informed the Governor that, immediately after the opening of Parifament to day, the Legislative Assembly, in the exercise of their undonited right, had proceeded to the election of their Speaker, that the choice had falled arou him, and that he had now to present himself to His Excellency as their Speaker, whereupon His Excellency was pleased to offer to him his congratulations. That he had then, in the name and ou behalf of the House, haid chain to all their undoubted rights and privileges, particularly to freedom of speech in debate, to free access to His Excellency when occasion should require, and that the most favourable construction should on all occasions, be put upon their language and proceedings; to all of which His Excellency had readily assented.

Mr. Speaker again expressed his appreciation, for the bonour the House had been pleased to confer upon him.
