WEDNESDAY, 12 JUNE, 1935.

1. OPENING OF PARLIAMENT:-The House met at Twelve o'clock at Noon, pursuant to a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor, bearing date the sixth day of June, 1935, of which a copy was read by William Rupert McCourt, Esquire, the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, as follows:-

By His Excellency Brigadier-General the Honourable "NEW SOUTH WALES, Sir Alexander Gore Arkwright Hore-Ruthven, "to wit. Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Com-("L.s.) panion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of Our Distinguished Service Order, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Victoria Cross, Our Governor of Our State of New South Wales and its

Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia.

"A. HORE-RUTHVEN, "Governor,

"In pursuance of the power and authority vested in me as such Governor "aforesaid by virtue of an Act passed in the second year of the Reign of His "late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, being 'An Act to consolidate the Acts "relating to the Constitution,' I do hereby proclaim that a session of the 'Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly for the State of New South "Wales for the despatch of business shall commence and be holden on Wednes-day, the twelfth day of June, 1935, at 12 o'clock noon, in the buildings known "as the Legislative Council Chambers, in Macquarie-street, in the City of "Sydney; and Members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, "respectively, are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and "place accordingly.

"Given under my Hand and Seal, at Sydney, this sixth day of June, in the 'year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in "the twenty-sixth year of His Majesty's Reign.

3. Message from the Commissioners:—The Usher of the Black Rod, being admitted, delivered a Message, that "The Commissioners request the immediate attendance of this Honorable House in the Legislative Council Chamber, to hear the Commission for opening of Parliament read."

The House went, and the Members of both Houses being seated at the request of the Commissioners,—

The President, on behalf of the Commissioners, then said,-

"Honorable Members of the Legislative Council, and Members of the Legis"lative Assembly,—His Excellency the Governor, not deeming it fit to be
"personally present here this day, has been pleased to cause a Commission to
"be issued under the Great Seal of the State, constituting us Commissioners
"to do on behalf of His Majesty, all things necessary to be done in the name
"of His Majesty, or in the name of His Excellency the Governor of the State
"in and about the opening and holding of this Parliament, to deliver a Message
"to the Legislative Assembly, and to do all such other things as may be specially
"necessary to enable Parliament to perform acts which admit of no delay, as
"will more fully appear by the Commission itself, which must now be read."

Whereupon the Clerk-Assistant (in the absence of the Clerk of the Parliaments), by direction of the President, read the said Commission, as follows:—

"George the Fifth, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the "British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor "of India.

"To all to whom these presents shall come,-

"Greeting,-

"Whereas by Proclamation made on the sixth day of June, 1935, His Excellency "the Honourable Sir Alexander Gore Arkwright Hore-Ruthven, Knight "Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint "George, Companion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion "of Our Distinguished Service Order, upon whom has been conferred the "Decoration of the Victoria Cross, Our Governor of Our State of New South "Wales and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, did, in "pursuance of the power and authority vested in him as Governor of Our said "State, by virtue of an Act passed in the second year of the reign of His late "Majesty King Edward the Seventh, being 'An Act to Consolidate the Acts "relating to the Constitution," proclaim that a Session of the Legislative Council "and Legislative Assembly constituted under the said Act, and composing the "Parliament of Our said State of New South Wales, should commence and be "holden on Wednesday, the twelfth day of June: And whereas, for certain "causes, Our said Governor cannot conveniently be present in person at the "opening of the said Session: Now know ye, that We, trusting in the discretion, "fidelity and care of Our trusty and well-beloved the Honorable Sir John "Beverley Peden, President of the said Legislative Council, the Honorable "Henry Edward Manning, Attorney-General and Vice-President of Our "Executive Council of Our said State, and the Honorable Ernest Henry Farrar, "Chairman of Committees, Members of the said Legislative Council, do, with "the advice of Our Executive Council of Our said State, give and grant by "the tenor of these presents unto the said Sir John Beverley Peden, Henry "Edward Manning, and Ernest Henry Farrar, so being such President and "Members of the said Legislative Council, or any two of them, full power in "Our name to open and hold the said Session of the said Legislative Council "and Legislative Assembly on the said twelfth day of June or subsequent day, "on Our behalf to do all things necessary to be done in Our Name, or in the "name of Our Governor of Our said State, in and about the opening and "holding of the said Parliament, to deliver a Message to the Legislative "Assembly, and to do all such things as may be specially necessary to enable

"Parliament to perform acts which admit of no delay: Commanding also by "the tenor of these presents all whom it concerns to meet in the said Parliament, "that to the said Sir John Beverley Peden, Henry Edward Manning and Ernest "Henry Farrar, or any two of them, they diligently attend in the premises in "the form aforesaid.

"In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made "Patent and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

"Witness Our Trusty and Well-beloved the Honorable Sir Alexander Gore "Arrayment Hore-Ruthven, Colonel on the Retired List of Our Army, "having the honorary rank of Brigadier-General, Knight Commander "of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, "Companion of Our Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Companion "of Our Distinguished Service Order, upon whom has been conferred "the Decoration of the Victoria Cross, Governor of Our State of New "South Wales and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, "at Sydney, in Our said State, this sixth day of June, in the year of "Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the "twenty-sixth year of Our Reign.

"A. HORE-RUTHVEN, "Governor,

The Members of both Houses being seated at the request of the President, the President said,—

"Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,---

"We have it in command from the Governor to let you know that, it "being necessary that a Speaker of the Legislative Assembly be chosen, it is "His Excellency's pleasure that you, Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly, "repair to your own Chamber, and there, after Members shall have been sworn, "proceed to the election of one of your number to be your Speaker."

4. Commission to Administer the Oath of Allegiance:—The Clerk informed the Assembly that he had received, through the office of the Premier, a Commission, under the hand of His Excellency the Governor, and bearing the Seal of the State, authorising the Honorable Bertram Sydney Barnsdale Stevens, Premier, Colonial Treasurer, and Minister for Public Works, Lieutenant-Colonel the Honorable Michael Frederick Brunner, Deputy-Premier and Minister for Transport, and the Honorable Ernest Albert Buttenshaw, Minister for Lands, or any one or more of them, to administer the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance to the King, required by law to be taken or made and subscribed by every Member before he shall be permitted to sit or vote in the Legislative Assembly,—which Commission the Clerk read, as follows:—

"By His Excellency the Honourable Sir Alexander Gore Arkwright "Hore-Ruthven, Colonel on the Retired List of the Army, having the honorary "rank of Brigadier-General, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished "Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most "Honourable Order of the Bath, Companion of the Distinguished Service "Order, upon whom has been conferred the Decoration of the Victoria Cross, "Governor of the State of New South Wales and its Dependencies, in the "Commonwealth of Australia.

"To all to whom these presents shall come,—
"Greeting:

"In pursuance of the authority in me vested in that behalf, I Sir Alexander "Gore Arkwright Hore-Ruthven, as Governor of the State of New South "Wales, do, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby authorise "the Honorable Bertram Sydney Barnsdale Stevens, Premier, Colonial Treasurer" and Minister for Public Works, Lieutenant-Colonel the Honorable Michael "Frederick Bruxner, Deputy-Premier and Minister for Transport, and the "Honorable Ernest Albert Buttenshaw, Minister for Lands, or any one or more "of them, to administer to all or any Members or Member of the said Legislative "Assembly the Oath or Affirmation of Allegiance to His Majesty the King, "required by Law to be taken or made and subscribed by every such Member "before he shall be permitted to sit or vote in the said Legislative Assembly.

"Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the State, at Sydney, in the "State of New South Wales aforesaid, this eleventh day of June, in "the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and "in the twenty-sixth year of the Reign of His Majesty King George-"the Fifth.

6. ELECTION OF SPEAKER:—Mr. Bate, addressing himself to the Clerk (who, standing up, pointed to him and then sat down), proposed to the House for their Speaker the Honorable Sir Daniel Levy, and moved, "That the Honorable Sir Daniel Levy do take the Chair of this House as Speaker,"—which motion was seconded by Mr. Sinclair and supported by Mr. Frank Burke.

VOTES AND PROCEEDINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. 12th June. 1935.

Having been conducted to the Chair, and standing on the upper step, the Honorable Sir Daniel Levy returned his acknowledgments to the House for the great honour they had been pleased to confer upon him by choosing him to be their Speaker,—

And thereupon sat down in the Chair.

Mr. Stevens and Mr. Lang congratulated the Speaker.

Mr. Stevens informed the House that he had ascertained that his Excellency the Governor would receive their Speaker at Government House forthwith.

7. Presentation of Speaker:—The House then proceeded to Government House to present their Speaker to His Excellency the Governor.—

And having returned,—Mr. Speaker reported that the Assembly had been to Government House, where he informed the Governor that, immediately after the opening of Parliament to-day, the Legislative Assembly, in the exercise of their undoubted right, had proceeded to the election of their Speaker, that the choice had fallen upon him, and that he had now to present himself to His Excellency as their Speaker,—whereupon His Excellency was pleased to offer him his congratulations. That he had then, on behalf of the House, laid claim of all their rights and privileges, particularly to freedom of speech in debate, to free access to His Excellency when occasion should require, and that the most favourable construction should, on all occasions, be put upon their language and proceedings; to all which His Excellency had readily assented. Mr. Speaker then repeated his grateful thanks for the honour the House had been pleased to confer upon him.
