Motion of Urgeney made (Mr. Treatt) to suspend Standing Orders to consider following motion:—"That this House is of opinion—(1) That the overwhelming verdict of the people at the Victorian elections was a vote for the preservation of personal freedom against dictatorial Government and a demunciation of Federal banking legislation which would deprive both the people and State Governments of their existing rights to bank with the trading banks thereby diminishing their financial independence.

(2) That the Government of New South Wales as a step towards the protection of the democratic right of the people of this State to have been a very of life should now hold a referendum of the electors in New South Wales on the issues involved in the Federal Government's banking legislation. (3) That the Government of New South Wales as a co-ordinate and independent unit under the Federal system should safeguard the constitutional and sovereign rights of this State by joining with the Governments of Victoria, South Australia and Western Australia in their proposed challenge to the Federal Government's banking legislation as soon as it becomes law."—Point of Order (Mr. Sheahan): That motion was out of order in that the matter of banking legislation was outside the constitutional limits of the State. Mr. Speaker, pointing out that the motion before the House was one of urgency, said the point should have been taken on the substantive motion. Even so, if (with the consent of the House) certain amendments were made the motion could be properly submitted to the House,—Motion, negatived, 67-8.

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Proposed alteration of Local Government Boundaries, 33.

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Motion (Mr. Enticknap) "(1) That, in the opinion of this House, a greater sum of money should be made available by the Commonwealth Government from the petrol tax to enable the lag in road construction and maintenance created throughout the State during the war years to be overcome. (2) That this Resolution be conveyed to the Commonwealth Government," and debate adjourned, 105-6.

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PRESERVATION OF SOVEREIGN POWERS OF STATE PARLIAMENTS IN RELATION TO PRICE-FIXING:—

Motion of Urgency (Mr. Treatt) That in opinion of House (1) The Federal System of Government affords safeguard against establishment of Dictatorial administration &c. &c. and that this Parliament should give lead to electors of State and advocate a "No" vote at forthcoming Referendum on Price-fixing legislation, &c. &c.—Point of order (Mr. Lazzarini) That Motion was out of Order because the question of Price-fixing was about to be submitted to people by way of Referendum. Mr. Speaker said that an Hon. Member was entitled to bring any matter before the House in accordance with Practice. It was for the House to decide the matter of Urgency,—negatived, 197-198.
