It was submitted that the suspension of Standing Orders on a previous day to pass a Bill through all stages in one day, did not hold force on a subsequent day, and that it was necessary for the House to again suspend Standing Orders to allow the Bill to be dealt with before the Address in Reply.

Mr. Speaker stated that the suspension of Standing Orders granted on one day applied from day to day, 35.

Anticipation of Debate:—

It was submitted that a subject sought to be discussed by a motion under 49th Standing Order, anticipated discussion on a Bill, notice of which had been given to-day.

Mr. Speaker, not receiving from the Minister an assurance that the Bill would come before the House within a reasonable time, ruled the motion in order, 143.

A notice of motion "That Standing Order 175B shall not be applied to the Loan Estimates for the current year", given by a private Member, ruled out of order by Mr. Speaker and removed from Business Paper, 143.

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Mr. Speaker stated that the mover of a motion may not also move "That the Question be now put" and ruled out of order a motion moved by Mr. Askin, 180.

Privilege:—

A motion was moved by the Member for Burwood, Mr. Doig, that the statement by the Minister for Housing, "that the Member for Burwood had not quoted the full text of certain documents", constituted a breach of Privilege.

Mr. Speaker ruled that the motion was not one involving Privilege, 232.

Messages to Council:—

It was submitted that the Minister, in the Message to the Council respecting Council's amendments in a Bill originating in the Assembly, had incorporated comments and reasons which were not part of the decisions of the Committee.

Mr. Speaker referred to a previous Ruling and also stated that the Standing Orders provided that reasons shall be drawn up by the Member in charge of the Bill and that it was not competent to move an amendment to the Message, and that the Message, being a formality, was not subject to debate, 274.

Adjournment of House under Standing Order 49:—

Mr. Speaker stated that a motion for the adjournment of the House had been placed in the box but owing to the operation of the Sessional Orders, it could not be entertained after six p.m., 290.

Mr. Speaker ruled the motion "The Attorney-General's failure to prosecute Dennis Brian Duffie of Aberdare on a charge of rape and his subsequent refusal to explain why this charge was dropped" out of order "for obvious reasons".

It was submitted that the House had been informed that Writs had issued.
