BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Use of Trust Lands

for War Purposes Act, 1916."

Trust lands may be used for naval or poses.

2. It shall be lawful and shall be deemed to have been lawful for any trustees or other legal or equitable military pur-holders of any lands devoted to charitable, public, re- 5 ligious, or other similar purposes to permit such lands to be used, occupied, or built upon by any person, with or without payment, for the drill, benefit, or comfort of any members of His Majesty's naval and military forces, provided that in cases after this Act the written approval 10 of such purposes signed by the State Commandant of such military forces shall be first obtained.
