A BILL

To provide endowment for the women's college; to amend certain Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

[MR. JAMES ;—13 *December*, 1916, A.M.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Women's College Short title. Endowment Act, 1916,” and shall be construed with the Women's College Act, 1902.

2. (1) There shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Council of the Women's College, in aid of the building fund of the college, a sum or sums not exceeding twenty thousand pounds in the whole, nor more than has been from time to time actually expended by the council for the purpose of building, which said sum or sums shall be paid by the Treasurer under warrants signed by the Governor. 5

(2) In arriving at the above-mentioned amount of twenty thousand pounds, all sums already paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, in pursuance of section two of the Act 53 Vic. No. 10, shall be taken into account. 10

Act No. 79, 1916.

An Act to provide endowment for the women's college; to amend certain Acts; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 20th December, 1916.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Women's College Endowment Act, 1916,” and shall be construed with the Women's College Act, 1902.
