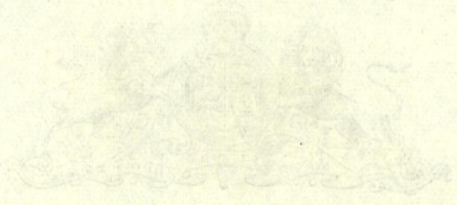

Act No. 1917

An Act to amend the Detention Act, 1915.

BE it enacted by His Majesty King George V, that the Detention Act, 1915, be amended in the manner hereinafter expressed, and that the amendments herein contained shall be deemed to have taken effect from the date of the passing of this Act.

1. This Act may be cited as the Detention Amendment Act, 1917.
2. Section 1 of the Detention Act, 1915, shall be amended as follows:
10 3. This Act shall not apply to any person in respect of whom proceedings commenced before the passing of this Act.
