BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Meat Industry short title. (Amendment) Act, 1919."

2. The Meat Industry Act, 1915, is amended as follows:—

Extension of application of Act.

(1) The term "the metropolitan abattoir area" is omitted each time it occurs in the said Act, and the term "a meat industry board abattoir 5 area" inserted in lieu thereof.

(2) Section six is repealed.

(3) Section seven:—

Definitions.

(a) In the definition of Board the word "Metropolitan" is omitted.

(b) The definition of "Metropolitan abattoir area" is omitted, and the following definition inserted in lieu thereof:—

"Meat Industry Board abattoir area" means the county of Cumberland, and 15 includes any area hereafter proclaimed in the Gazette by the Governor as a Meat Industry Board abattoir area.

each day on which he carries on such business after he has been notified that he is so doing in contravention of this Act:

Provided that any person who is carrying on such a business at the date of the commencement of this Act, shall not be liable to a penalty if his premises or carts in connection with the business are registered within three months from such date.

(2) All applications for registration 10 and renewals of registration shall be made to the Board in the prescribed manner and form by the person intending to so use the premises or carts. The Board may refuse any application or may issue a certificate of registration or 15 renew the registration, as the case may be, subject to such conditions and the payment of such fees as may be prescribed.

A certificate of registration so issued or renewed shall continue in force for the period 20 of twelve months from the date of issue or

renewal respectively:

Provided that the Board may at any time, for sufficient reason, cancel any such certificate.

Provided further that where such cancellation 25 is made on the sole ground that excessive prices have been charged the Board shall state such ground in writing, and the person carrying on such business, manufacture, or sale, the registration of whose premises or cutting cart 30 has been so cancelled, may appeal against such cancellation to a District Court judge whose decision shall be final.

(3) The Board may make by-laws to carry out the provisions of this section.

Such by-laws shall be subject to the provisions of subsection two of section thirty hereof.

(10) Section thirty, subsection one, paragraph one: Omit "regulating and controlling the 40 use of the same" and insert in lieu thereof "prescribing the terms and conditions upon which the same may be used."
