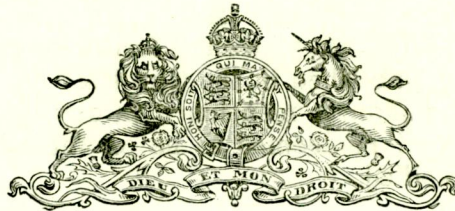

Act No.       , 1918.

An Act to declare that certain persons shall be entitled to have their names placed on certain municipal rolls; to amend the Acts relating to the corporation of the City of Sydney; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Corporation Short title. (Rolls Declaratory) Act, 1918," and shall be construed with the Sydney Corporation Act, 1902, and the Acts amending that Act.

**2.** Any person whose name was on the roll of the year one thousand nine hundred and fifteen for any ward, and whose name was by mistake omitted from the roll of the year one thousand nine hundred and eighteen for that ward, may apply before the twenty-fifth day of November to the chamber magistrate of the Central Police Court to have his name placed on such last-mentioned roll.

Certain persons may apply to have their names placed on roll.

- Such magistrate, on being satisfied of the above-mentioned facts, and that the applicant, at the time of his application, is still entitled to have his name placed on the roll last mentioned, shall issue a certificate to that effect to the Town Clerk, who shall forthwith cause such certificate to be published in the Gazette.
- 15** Any person whose name is mentioned in any certificate so published shall be deemed to be on the roll of the ward therein specified.
