Act No. , 1918.

An Act to authorise the Senate of the University of Sydney to defray from the statutory endowment the fees, at Universities and Educational Institutions abroad, of certain persons holding public exhibitions at the University of Sydney; for that purpose to amend the Acts relating to such University; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "University Amendment (Exhibitioners' Fees) Act, 1918," and shall be construed with the University and University Colleges Act, 1900, and the Acts amending the same.

University Amendment (Exhibitioners' Fees).

2. The Senate of the University of Sydney may apply any portion of the endowment fund in or towards the payment of fees, at any university or educational institution abroad, for or on behalf of any person holding a public exhibition at the University of Sydney, who before or after the commencement of this Act has been engaged on war service.

Power of Senate to apply endowment fund to certain fees.

3. The Senate may make by-laws and regulations prescribing the nature of war service which will entitle a person to receive the benefits of this Act, and generally to carry out the provisions of this Act.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "University Amendment (Exhibitioners' Fees) Act, 1918," and shall be construed with the University and University Colleges Act, 1900, and the Acts amending the same. Short title.

3. The Senate may make by-laws and regulations prescribing the nature of war service which will entitle a person to receive the benefits of this Act, and 10 generally to carry out the provisions of this Act.

Act No. 43, 1918.

An Act to authorise the Senate of the University of Sydney to defray from the statutory endowment the fees, at Universities and Educational Institutions abroad, of certain persons holding public exhibitions at the University of Sydney; for that purpose to amend the Acts relating to such University; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "University Amend- Short title.
ment (Exhibitioners' Fees) Act, 1918," and shall be construed with the University and University Colleges Act, 1900, and the Acts amending the same. **2.**
