An Act to amend the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912. [Assented to, 12th October, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Banks and Bank Short title. Holidays (Amendment) Act, 1917," and shall be read with the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912, hereinafter called the Principal Act.
