BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Jury (Amendment) Act, 1918." Short title.

2. Section five of the Jury Act, 1912, is amended by inserting the following paragraphs next after paragraph (p) :— Amendment of s. 5 of Principal Act.

"(p i) commercial travellers whose usual place of residence is within the jurors' district for the city of Sydney, and whose business in that capacity is carried on outside that district ;

"(p ii) mining managers and under-managers of mines in which not less than ten men are employed in mining operations."

Enacted by the Parliament of the State of South Australia, in the
fiftieth year of His Majesty King George V.

That His Majesty King George V. do give His assent to the
Bill for an Act to amend the law relating to the regulation of
mining operations in the State of South Australia.

1. This Act may be cited as the MINE ACT, 1912.

2. Section five of the MINE ACT, 1911, is amended by
inserting the following paragraphs next after paragraph
of that section:

- (p) commercial travellers whose usual place of
residence is within the jurors' district for the
city of Sydney, and whose business in that
district is carried on outside that district.
- (q) mining managers and under-managers of mines
in which not less than ten men are employed
in mining operations.

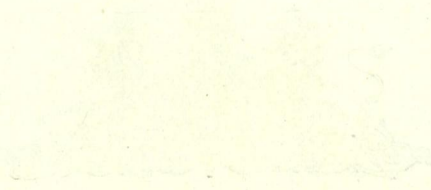
