BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Prisons (Amendment) Act, 1918." Short title.

2. The following section is inserted, and shall be read next after section nineteen of the Prisons Act, 1899:— New section.

19A. Every person who conveys or attempts to convey any letter or document, or any article whatever into or out of any prison, in contravention of any regulation made under this Act, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds. Conveying letters, &c., into or out of prison. cf. 28 and 29 Vic., c. 126, s. 39.

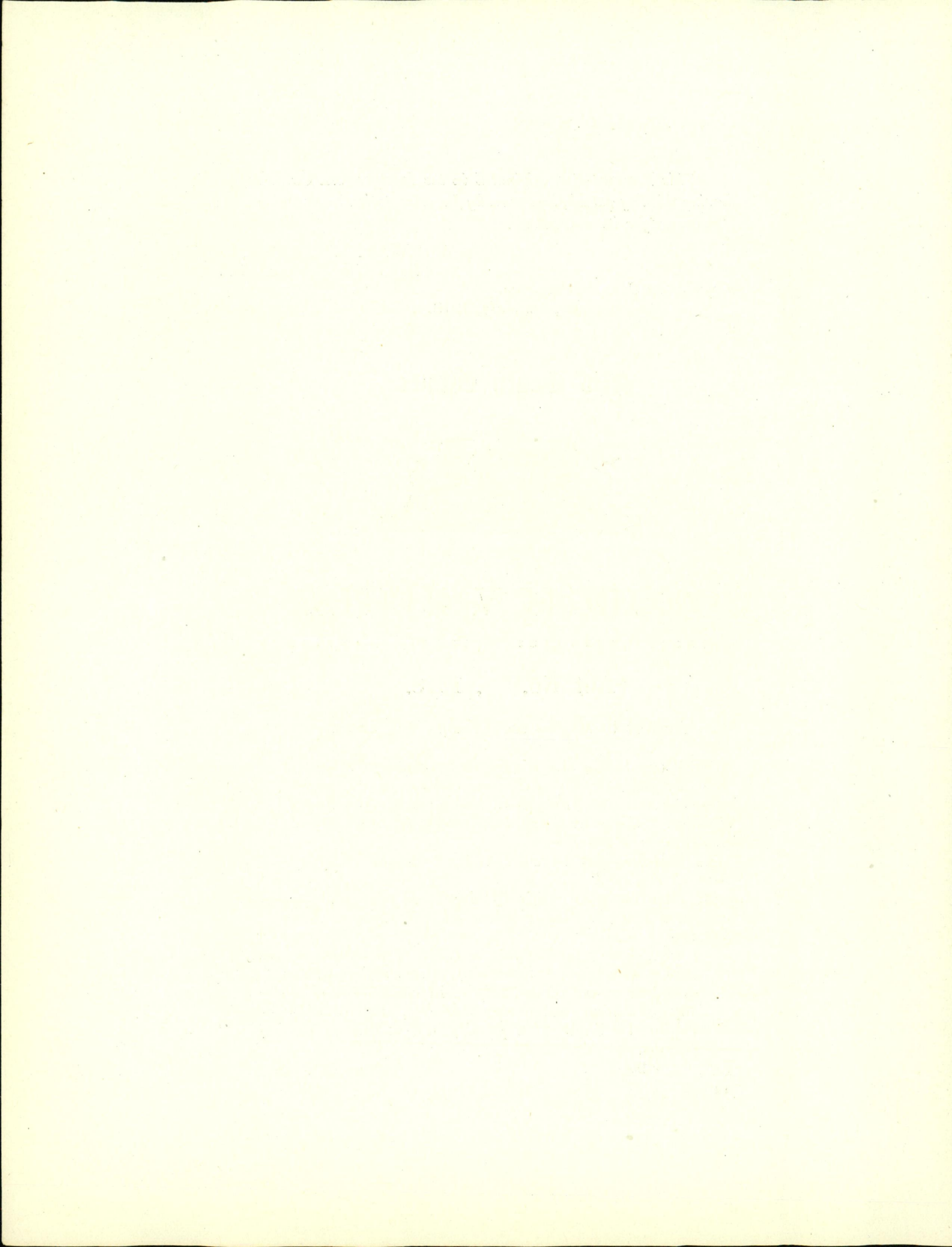
