BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Registration of Short title. Deeds (Amendment) Act, 1918."

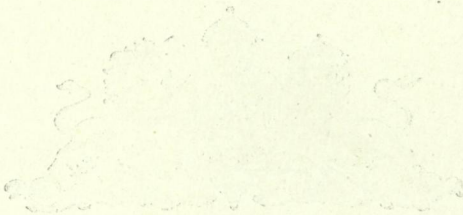

COMMONWEALTH OF AUSTRALIA

GEORGE V BEECHER.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE REGISTRATION OF DEBTS ACT.

1918.

ENACTED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR GENERAL, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by section 64 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Australia, that the following Act should have effect:

1. It is enacted that section 10 of the Registration of Debts Act, 1912, shall be amended by substituting for the words "the Registrar" the words "the Registrar-General".

2. It is enacted that section 11 of the Registration of Debts Act, 1912, shall be amended by substituting for the words "the Registrar" the words "the Registrar-General".

3. It is enacted that section 12 of the Registration of Debts Act, 1912, shall be amended by substituting for the words "the Registrar" the words "the Registrar-General".

4. It is enacted that section 13 of the Registration of Debts Act, 1912, shall be amended by substituting for the words "the Registrar" the words "the Registrar-General".

5. It is enacted that the Governor may, by regulations which he is hereby authorised to make, provide that such copy instead of being upon vellum or parchment may be upon such material as may be specified in such regulations.
