9. A deserted wife is placed by the Bill on the same basis as a widow.

An Act to provide for the endowment of motherhood by making payments to mothers and other persons in certain cases; to amend certain Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

DE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, B by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority 5 of the same, as follows :---
