Act No. 20, 1920.

An Act to make further provision with regard to the allowances to members of the Legislative Assembly and the salaries of Ministers of the Crown and of certain other persons; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Ministers' Salaries Act, 1908, the Parliamentary Representatives Allowance Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 21st December, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act shall commence on the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, and may be cited as the "Parliamentary Representatives Allowance and Ministers' Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1920."
