Act No. 35, 1920.

An Act to enable certain Parliamentary Select Committees to sit during the adjournment or prorogation of Parliament; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 31st December, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Short title. Select Committees (Agricultural and Metalliferous Industries) Enabling Act, 1920."

2. It is hereby declared that the Select Committee Certain Select Committees may sit, &c., during prorogation. of the Legislative Council appointed on the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, to inquire into and report upon the Agricultural Industry, and the Select Committee of the Legislative Assembly appointed on the twenty-first day of October of the said year, to inquire into and report upon the Metalliferous Industry may lawfully sit during the period for which Parliament stands adjourned or prorogued, and do all such things as they lawfully may do while Parliament is in session.

I have examined this Bill, and find it to correspond in all respects with the Bill as finally passed by both Houses.

Act No. , 1920.

An Act to enable certain Parliamentary Select Committees to sit during the adjournment or prorogation of Parliament; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Short title.

2. It is hereby declared that the Select Committee Certain Select Committees may sit, &c., during prorogation.
