## Act No. 4, 1920.

An Act to provide for the nomination, election, and appointment of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for the present Parliament; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto. [Assented to, 6th October, 1920.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works Election Enabling Act, 1920." Short title.

2. The nomination, election, and appointment of the members of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for the present Parliament may, notwithstanding anything in the Public Works Act, 1912, be made and held in the manner prescribed by the said Act at any time during the second or any subsequent session of the present Parliament. Election of Public Works Committee for present Parliament.

Act No. , 1920.

An Act to provide for the nomination, election, and appointment of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for the present Parliament; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works Election Enabling Act, 1920." Short title.

**2.** The nomination, election, and appointment of the 10 members of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for the present Parliament may, notwithstanding anything in the Public Works Act, 1912, be made and held in the manner prescribed by the said Act at any time during the second or any subsequent 15 session of the present Parliament. Act No. 1930

An Act to provide for the organization, powers, and jurisdiction of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and to amend the Federal Bureau of Investigation Act, 1913, and for purposes connected therewith.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, February 20, 1930.

1. That the Federal Bureau of Investigation be organized as a bureau of the Department of Justice, and that the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation be appointed by the President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, for a term of four years, and that he may be reappointed for one or more terms of four years each.
2. That the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation be authorized to employ such persons as he may deem necessary, and that he be authorized to fix the salaries of such persons, not exceeding the salaries of persons employed in the same grade in the Department of Justice.
