GEORGII V REGIS.

Act No. 9, 1920.

An Act to declare the law with regard to the sitting of Courts of Quarter Sessions; and for that purpose to amend the Crimes Act, 1900. [Assented to, 26th October, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Quarter Sessions Enabling Act, 1920." Short title.

2. It is hereby declared that it has been and is lawful for a court of quarter sessions to sit in two or more divisions at the same time at any place appointed for the holding of such court. A court of quarter sessions may sit in two or more divisions.

I have examined this Bill, and find it to correspond in all respects with the Bill as finally passed by both Houses.
