Act No. , 1920.

An Act to regulate the unshipping, delivery, receipt, storing, and disposal of goods in the port of Sydney; to amend the Sydney Harbour Trust Act, 1900; and for purposes consequent thereon or incidental thereto.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as "The Sydney Port Short title. (Goods Delivery) Act, 1920," and shall be construed with the Sydney Harbour Trust Act, 1900, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Act.

2. This Act shall commence and come into force on Commencea date to be notified by proclamation of the Governor ment. published in the Gazette.

3. The following new Part is inserted next after New Part. 5 Part III of the Principal Act :--

PART IIIA.

THE UNSHIPPING AND DELIVERY OF GOODS.

67A. This Part shall apply to goods unshipped Application upon any wharf vested in the Commissioners and of this Part. consigned from any place outside the Common-

wealth, and to goods so unshipped or consigned from any place within the Commonwealth to which the Governor, by proclamation in the Gazette, applies the provisions of this Part, except goods in respect of which a transhipment entry has been passed or lodged in accordance with the provisions of section sixty-nine of this Act.

67B. Goods shall not be unshipped upon any such Goods to be wharf unless they are delivered to the lessee of the delivered to wharf or to a wharfinger licensed in pursuance of licensed the regulations, hereinafter in this Act termed a wharfinger.

67c. The lessee or the licensed wharfinger to Receipt and whom such goods are so delivered shall, as agent delivery.

for the consignee, give a receipt therefor to the master of the vessel, and shall, subject to regulations made under this Part, be responsible to the consignee for such goods, and shall deliver them to the consignee, or dispose of them in accordance with such regulations.

67D. (1) The Commissioners may, with the Regulations. approval of the Governor, make regulations generally for carrying out the provisions of this Part, and in particular for—

 (a) regulating and controlling the unshipping, receiving, handling, sorting, stacking, and delivering of goods, and fixing the maximum charges which may be imposed and collected therefor, and providing for enforcing the payment of such charges;
