2. Notwithstanding anything contained in any Act or deed of conveyance the council of the Municipality of Waverley may subdivide and sell for such amount and upon such conditions as it may deem fit the land described in Schedule One hereto which now forms part of Waverley Cemetery lands.

3. The proceeds of the sale shall be paid into the general fund of the council and shall be expended by the council in constructing and maintaining certain roads in the vicinity of the cemetery as set out in Schedule Two hereto.






