

A BILL

To enable certain Parliamentary Select Committees to sit during the adjournment or prorogation of Parliament; and for purposes connected therewith.

[MR. KAVANAGH;—10 *December*, 1920.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Select Committees (Agricultural and Metalliferous Industries) Enabling Act, 1920." Short title.

2. It is hereby declared that the Select Committee of the Legislative Council appointed on the twenty-third day of September, one thousand nine hundred and twenty, to inquire into and report upon the Agricultural Industry, and the Select Committee of the Legislative Assembly appointed on the twenty-first day of October of the said year, to inquire into and report upon the Metalliferous Industry may lawfully sit during the period for which Parliament stands adjourned or prorogued, and do all such things as they lawfully may do while Parliament is in session. Certain Select Committees may sit, &c., during prorogation.

This PUBLIC BILL originated in the LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL, and, having this day passed, is now ready for presentation to the LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY for its concurrence.

An Act to enable certain Parliamentary Select Committees to sit during the adjournment or prorogation of Parliament; and for purposes connected therewith.

Act No. 1920.

An Act to enable certain Parliamentary Select
Committees to examine the operations of the Government or
departments of Government, and for purposes
connected therewith.

1. It is hereby enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council and Parliament of New South
Wales in Parliament assembled, that the authority of

the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Select
Committees (Amendment) Act, 1920."
2. It is hereby enacted that the Select Committee
(Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry) shall be
appointed on the twenty-third day of September,
one thousand nine hundred and twenty,
to inquire into and report upon the operations of
the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and
Forestry, and the Select Committee of the Legislative
Assembly appointed on the twenty-first day of October
of the said year, to inquire into and report upon the
operations of the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries
and Forestry, may lawfully sit during the
period for which Parliament stands adjourned or
prolonged, and do all such things as they lawfully may
do while Parliament is in session.
