Act No. , 1924.

An Act to make certain provisions as to the observance of Anzac Day, and for that purpose to amend the Liquor Act, 1912, and the Gaming and Betting Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; to authorise in certain circumstances the proclamation of half holidays under the Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912, and for that purpose to amend that Act.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Anzac Day Act, Short title. 1924."

2. The Liquor Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Amendment of Act No. 42, 1912 Acts, is amended by inserting in section fifty-seven after s. 57. 1921 No. the words "Christmas Day" the words "or upon the 13. 8. 2 (3); W.A. 1923 No. twenty-fifth day of April (Anzac Day) in any year."

3. (1) It shall be unlawful for any racing club or Race person to hold or conduct any race meeting on Anzac Marac Day Day.

For any contravention of the provisions of this No. 13, subsection, the secretary and all the members of the s. 3 (4):
W.A. 1923 10 committee or executive body of such racing club, and No. 35, any other person so offending, shall jointly and severally ss. 3, 4. be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds.

"Anzac Day" means the twenty-fifth day of April in each year.

"Racing club" means any club, company, or association, incorporated or otherwise, formed for the purpose of promoting horse-racing or pony racing or trotting contests.

4. The Banks and Bank Holidays Act, 1912, is Halfholidays. amended by omitting section nineteen and by inserting Amendment of Act 1912 in lieu thereof the following new section:—

- 19. (1) The Governor may by proclamation in Proclamation the Gazette appoint a special day or the afternoon holiday or a 25 or the morning of a day to be observed as a public half holiday. holiday either throughout New South Wales or in any part thereof or in any city, municipality, shire, or district therein.
 - (2) The proclamation shall be published at least seven days before the public holiday so appointed.
 - (3) Any day or part of a day so appointed shall be kept as a close holiday in all banks within the locality mentioned in the proclamation.
 - (4) Any day so appointed shall as regards bills of exchange and promissory notes payable as aforesaid be deemed to be a bank holiday for all the purposes of this Act.

(5) The part of a day so appointed shall not in respect of business at a bank within the locality be a reasonable hour within the meaning of any law relating to bills of exchange or be within banking or business hours within any law practice or custom relating to banks or bankers.
