### Act No. 29, 1924.

An Act to amend the Architects Act, 1921, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 3rd December, 1924.]

B E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Architects Short title.

(Amendment) Act, 1924."

2. The Architects Act, 1921, is amended as follows:— Amendment of Act No. 8, 1921.

(1) By omitting subsection two of section eight; Sec. 8.

(2) by inserting the following new section next New s. 8A. after section eight:—

8A. (1) For the purposes of this Act there Architects shall be constituted a fund, to be called the Funα.

#### Architects (Amendment).

(2) Such fund shall be carried to a special account in the Treasury, shall be under the control of the board, and shall be operated on by the board in pursuance of this Act.

(3) As soon as is practicable after the commencement of the Architects (Amendment) Act, 1924, there shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the credit of the Architects Fund a sum equivalent to the difference between the amount paid prior to that date into the Treasury by the registrar in pursuance of this Act and the amount which, prior to the said date, was paid out of the Treasury to meet the costs and expenses of the administration of this Act.

(4) All moneys received by the board or the registrar, including fees and penalties,

shall be paid into the Architects Fund.

(5) The fees of members and the salaries and emoluments of the officers appointed under this Act, and all other expenses of and incidental to the administration of this Act, shall be resident and after the Architects Florid

be paid out of the Architects Fund.

(6) Any surplus moneys in the Architects Fund which are not required for the purposes of the last preceding subsection may be expended by the board for the purposes of the advancement of architecture in such manner as it may determine;

(3) by omitting subsection two of section twenty-four.
