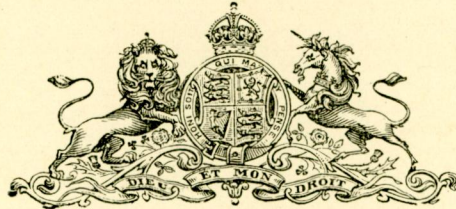

Act No. 19, 1923.

An Act to amend the Bread Act, 1901, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 26th November, 1923.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Bread (Amendment) Act, 1923."

2. Section ten of the Bread Act, 1901, is omitted.

3. The Early Closing (Amendment) Act, 1919, is amended by omitting section five.

Amendment of Act No. 49 of 1919, s. 5.
