
EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THIS Bill is to amend Section 54 of the Coal Mines Regulation Act, General Rule 12, paragraph (m), which at present provides that :---

"Neither gunpowder nor any other explosive which is not on the list of permitted explosives in force for the time being shall be used in any mine which is not both naturally wet and free from inflammable gas."

The object of the Bill is to modify the prohibition contained in the existing rule by limiting its application to those parts of a mine which are dry and dusty or which are not free from inflammable gas.
