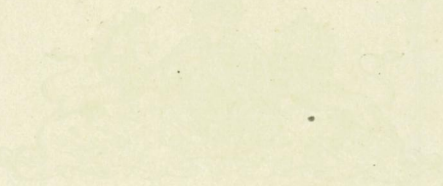

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, February 22, 1921.

1. That the word "and" in section 1 of the District Court Act, 1912, be amended as follows:

2. That the word "and" in section 2 of the District Court Act, 1912, be amended as follows:

(a) By striking from subsection one of section 1 the words "and" and inserting in their place the word "or";

(b) By striking from subsection two of the same section the word "and" and inserting in its place the word "or";

(c) By striking from subsection three of the same section the word "and" and inserting in its place the word "or";

(d) By striking from subsection four of the same section the word "and" and inserting in its place the word "or";

(e) By striking from subsection five of the same section the word "and" and inserting in its place the word "or";

(f) By striking from subsection six of the same section the word "and" and inserting in its place the word "or";

(g) By striking from subsection seven of the same section the word "and" and inserting in its place the word "or";
