Act No. 8, 1924.

An Act to exempt dentists and certain other persons from serving upon juries ; to amend the law as to jurors districts, the service of juror's summons, and the preparation of jury lists ; to amend the Jury Act, 1912 ; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 25th September, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Jury (Amendment) Act, 1924." Short title.

(1A) (a) If the Supreme Court is appointed to be held at such town or place, the said clerk shall, before transmitting such copy to the sheriff, mark thereon and on the original corrected list the name of every person described in the said list as a justice of the peace, lessee of the Crown, banker, bank director, merchant, accountant, engineer, manager of a station, broker, chemist, druggist, warehouseman, commission agent, architect, or as the owner or tenant of any lands or tenements of the yearly value of one hundred pounds and upwards.

(b) The mark shall consist of a capital letter “S” and a number in red ink prefixed to the name of every such person.

(c) The numbers shall be in a regular arithmetical series.

(d) The names so marked shall for the purposes of this Act constitute the special jurors’ list for the jurors’ district.

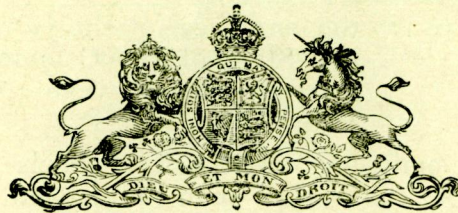

20. Immediately after making out the Sydney jurors' book the sheriff shall mark in red ink the names of all special jurors contained therein in the manner prescribed in subsection two of section fifteen of this Act, and the names so numbered shall constitute the "Sydney Special Jurors' Book";

 (v) by inserting in subsection two of section twenty-three after the words "Part IV" the words "and Part V";
 (vi) by omitting section twenty-four;
 (d) by omitting subsection two of section forty-five.
