Act No. 15, 1922.

An Act to amend the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, 1901; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 19th October, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Lotteries and Art Unions (Amendment) Act, 1922,"

Lotteries and Art Unions (Amendment).

(2) This Act shall not come into operation until the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.

(1) Where a bazaar or fancy fair is held for raising funds in aid of any eleemosynary or charitable institution, either separately or in conjunction with or in the same building or enclosed space as an entertainment of any kind held for a like purpose and not for private gain, the sale of goods, wares, and merchandise other than spirituous or fermented liquors or tobacco in any form may be effected at such bazaar or fancy fair by lottery or raffle:

Provided that no goods, wares, or merchandise shall be so sold unless they are exposed for sale at the bazaar or fancy fair, and no shares or tickets in the lottery or raffle shall be sold or offered for sale at any place other than at the bazaar or fancy fair, or in the same building or enclosed space as the case may be.

(2) None of the provisions of the third section of this Act shall be deemed or construed to extend or relate to any such lottery or raffle at a bazaar or fancy fair as is authorised by this section.

- (b) makes or concurs in the making of any false or fraudulent entry in any book, document, or voucher relating to a lottery or raffle; or
- (c) omits or concurs in omitting any material particular from any book, document, voucher or balance-sheet relating to a lottery or raffle,

shall be guilty of an indictable offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE various clauses of the present Bill which amend the Lotteries and Art Unions Act, 1901, in certain respects are self-explanatory. The matters dealt with include the following :—

- (1) A declaration of the existing law in certain particulars. See clause 2.
 - (2) Certain amendments to section 3 of the Act which are deemed necessary in order to carry into effect the provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of that section.
 - (3) Provision for certain matters as to which section 4 of the Act is silent, with the object of defining clearly the circumstances and conditions under and subject to which lotteries and raffles may be conducted for charitable purposes.
 - (4) Provision for certain subsidiary matters arising out of or in connection with the holding of lotteries in cases where the same are permitted under the Act. See clauses 5-9. The object of these clauses is to safeguard the interests of the public and of charitable and eleemosynary institutions to whose benefit the funds arising from such lotteries are to be devoted.
 - (5) The insertion in the Act of certain new sections prohibiting the furtherance in New South Wales of lotteries conducted outside this State.

An Act to amend the Lotteries and Art Unions
Act, 1901 ; and for other purposes.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty,
by and with the advice and consent of the Legis-
lative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South
Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of

1. This Act may be cited as the " Lotteries and Art Unions (Amendment) Act, 1922." Short title.

The Attorney-General may at any time by notice in writing under his hand call upon the promoter, secretary, treasurer, or any one of the committee (or any person who purported to act in any such capacity) of any bazaar or fancy fair to lodge with him a balance-sheet showing the whole of the receipts and disbursements in connection with any raffle or lottery conducted at the bazaar or fancy fair within a time to be specified in the notice, and to produce to such person and at such time and place as is set out in the notice any books, documents, and vouchers relating to the raffle or lottery. New sec. 11. Balance-sheet of raffles.

When any such balance-sheet, books, documents, or vouchers have been produced in accordance with a notice given under either of the last two preceding sections the Attorney-General may direct that the same shall be handed to the Auditor-General, who is hereby authorised and directed to receive, examine, and audit the same and for that purpose to make such inquiries as to him shall seem proper and necessary, and to report the result of his audit to the Attorney-General.

(1) Whosoever is required to lodge a balance-sheet or to produce any books, documents, or vouchers in accordance with sections eleven and twelve of this Act, and who fails to do so within the time specified in that behalf in the notice given to him shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

(2) Whosoever refuses to answer the inquiries made by the Auditor-General shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

14. Whosoever with intent to defraud or deceive any other person—

- (b) makes or concurs in the making of any false or fraudulent entry in any book, document, or voucher relating to a lottery or raffle; or
- (c) omits or concurs in omitting any material particular from any book, document, voucher or balance-sheet relating to a lottery or raffle,

shall be guilty of an indictable offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years.

15. Any prize unclaimed by the person holding the ticket entitling him thereto, or by some person duly authorised in that behalf, for a period of three months after the drawing of the lottery or raffle, shall

Offences.

Whosoever is concerned in the conducting of the lottery for which an association has been formed under the provisions of this Act or of any raffle or lottery held at any bazaar or fancy fair and converts to his own use any of the prizes or any part of the moneys raised by means of such lottery or raffle shall be guilty of an indictable offence, and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years. Misappropriation of funds or prizes.

Whosoever with intent to defraud conducts, or concurs in conducting, the drawing of any lottery or raffle in such a manner or under such conditions that all persons who have purchased tickets or shares in the lottery or raffle have not an equal chance of drawing a prize, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds. 10 20. Whosoever prints or publishes any advertisement, notice, or information relating to a foreign lottery, or displays upon any premises in his occupation any card, poster, or notice relating to a foreign lottery, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred pounds.

15 21. Whosoever sells or offers for sale or accepts any money in respect of the purchase of any ticket or share in a foreign lottery shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
