Act No. 2, 1922.

An Act to reduce the allowances to members of the Legislative Assembly and the salaries of Ministers of the Crown and of certain other persons; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Ministers' Salaries Act, 1908, the Parliamentary Representatives Allowance Act, 1912, the Parliamentary Representatives Allowance and Ministers' Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1920, and certain other Acts; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 6th May, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1922."
