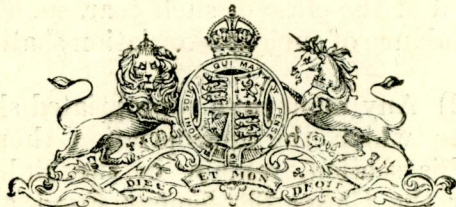

GEORGI II V REGIS.

Act No. 15, 1924.

An Act to provide for the lapse of unapplied appropriations from the Public Works Fund or the Closer Settlement Fund; and for that purpose to amend the Public Works and Closer Settlement Funds Act, 1906. [Assented to, 14th October, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Works Short title. and Closer Settlement Funds (Amendment) Act, 1924."

Lapse of ap-

2. The Public Works and Closer Settlement Funds Act, 1906, is amended by the addition next after section eleven thereof of the following new section:—

12. (1) Where any appropriation or balance of an appropriation made out of the Public Works Fund or the Closer Settlement Fund by any Act passed two years or longer before the close of any financial year (whether such Act was passed before or after the commencement of this Act) remains unapplied at the close of such year, such appropriation or balance of such appropriation shall thereupon lapse.

(2) Any moneys so appropriated shall, to the extent to which the appropriation thereof lapses under this section, remain in the Public Works Fund or the Closer Settlement Fund, as the case may be, and may be made available therefrom as in this Act provided.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty I assent to this Act.
