# GEORGII V REGIS.

## Act No. 7, 1922.

An Act to sanction the carrying out of certain works in order to amplify and improve the Sydney Water Supply; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 12th September, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Water Short title. Supply Act, 1922." 2.

Works sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the works described in the First, Second, and Third Schedules is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works.

Estimated described in Schedule I.

3. The cost of carrying out the works described in cost of works the First Schedule is estimated at two million four hundred and twenty-eight thousand two hundred and ninety-three pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

Estimated Schedule II.

4. The cost of carrying out the works described in the cost of works Second Schedule is estimated at two hundred and fiftytwo thousand five hundred and ninety-nine pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

Estimated cost of works described in

5. The cost of carrying out the works described in the Third Schedule is estimated at three hundred and Schedule III. eighteen thousand three hundred pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

Vesting of works in Board of Water Supply and Sewerage.

**6.** On the completion of the said works or any of them the Governor shall forthwith notify the same in the Gazette, and upon such notification the works described in such notification shall be vested in the Board of Water Supply and Sewerage under the provisions of and for the purposes of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Acts, 1880-1916.


