Act No. 34, 1922.

An Act to sanction the construction of a line of tramway from Undercliffe to Forest Hill; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 24th November, 1922.]

B it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Undercliffe to Short title. Forest Hill Tramway Act, 1922."

Undercliffe to Forest Hill Tramway.

Work sanctioned.

The plan.

Cost, and how to be defrayed 2. The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Undercliffe to Forest Hill (Earlwood) Tramway," signed by the Railway Commissioners for New South Wales, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Railway and Tramway Construction, and deposited in the office of the said Commissioners.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work, estimated at twenty-two thousand three hundred and eighty pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), may be defrayed from such Loan Votes as are now or may hereafter be applicable to the purpose, or from appropriations of the Public Works Fund, or partly from such votes and partly from such appropriations, and shall not under any circumstances exceed the estimated cost by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

THIS tramway commences at the terminus of the Undercliffe tram at the corner of Illawarra-road and Riverside-street, on the northern side of Cook's River, and proceeds in a southerly direction, and crosses Cook's River at Undercliffe Bridge, a few chains beyond which it takes a generally south-westerly direction along Homer-street to the corner of that street and William-street at Forest Hill, where the line terminates, being a total distance of 1 mile 20 chains, and subject to such deviations and modifications as may be considered desirable by the Constructing Authority.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty I assent to this Act.
