BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Metropolitan Short title. Water and Sewerage (Amendment) Act, 1922," and shall be construed with the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Acts, 1880-1916.

2. (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section twenty-seven of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Act of 1880, the Governor, by proclamation published in the Gazette, may revoke and cancel the proclamation of the Metropolitan Catchment Area, published in pursuance of that section in the Gazette of sixth July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and from time to time proclaim and define the boundaries of a catchment area or catchment areas for the purpose of supplying water to any places or districts.

(2) A catchment area proclaimed in pursuance of this section shall be subject to the provisions of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Acts, 1850-1916, or any Act amending the same, relating to a catchment area proclaimed under the Metropolitan Water and

Metropolitan Water and Sewerage (Amendment) Bill.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Act, 1880 (Section 27), required the Governor to proclaim the boundaries of the Metropolitan Catchment Area, and this was done.

On a re-survey of the original catchment area it appears that certain lands should be excluded from the proclamation and others included.

Further, the construction of additional dams in connection with the Sydney Water Supply necessitates the proclamation of new areas or the inclusion of additional lands in the proclaimed catchment area. Again, the Board's powers have by subsequent Acts been extended to water supplies for various districts other than the metropolitan district, some of which have separate catchments.

This Bill therefore amends section 27 of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Act, 1880, and gives general powers of proclaiming and amending catchment areas.

The Board's powers for preventing the pollution of water being at present limited to the existing proclaimed area, the necessary amendment is made in section 12 of the Metropolitan Water and Sewerage Amendment Act, 1916, to extend such powers to all catchment areas.
