An Act to authorise the Commonwealth of Australia to occupy and use a certain portion of Observatory Park for the purpose of the erection and maintenance thereon of a Weather Bureau; to amend the Sydney Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1908; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 4th October, 1923.]

DE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Observatory Park Short title. Weather Bureau Site Act, 1923."

This Act shall not confer any right, power, or authority on the Commonwealth of Australia to sell, mortgage, alienate, charge, or otherwise deal with the land or any part thereof, or to part with the possession of the land or any part thereof, or to use the land or any part thereof for any purpose other than those mentioned in the last preceding section.


