## Act No. 1, 1926.

An Act to enable His Majesty to authorise the Governor to summon women to the Legislative Council, and for that purpose to amend the Constitution Act, 1902. [Assented to, 27th January, 1926.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same. as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution short title, (Amendment) Act, 1925," and shall be read with the Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts.


2. The Constitution Act, 1902, is amended by Amendment inserting at the end of section sixteen the following of Act 1902 paragraph:—

The word "person" in this section shall be construed as including a woman whether married or unmarried.
