An Act to make certain provisions regarding the Members of the Legislative Council; for this purpose to amend the Government Railways Act, 1912, the Public Works Act, 1912, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows :-

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Legislative short title Councillors Act, 1926," and shall be read and construed and commencement with the Constitution (Amendment) Act, 1926.

(2) This Act shall commence and come into force 10 at the commencement of the Constitution (Amendment)

## Legislative Councillors.

2. (1) Every person who upon the day preceding Privileges of the date of the commencement of this Act is a member members of Legislative of the Legislative Council shall retain and continue to Council to be entitled to the following privileges—

(a) to hold and use the free pass issued to him under section fifty-eight of the Government

Railways Act, 1912; and

(b) to enter Parliament House, to use the Parliamentary Library, and to enjoy such other privileges of a member of the Legislative Council as exist upon the day preceding the date of the commencement of this Act:

Provided that any such Member who-

(a) takes any oath, or makes any declaration or acknowledgment of allegiance, obedience, or adherence to any foreign prince or power; or

(b) does, concurs in, or adopts any act whereby he may become a subject or citizen of any foreign State or power, or whereby he may become entitled to the rights, privileges, or immunities of a subject or citizen of any foreign State or power; or

(c) becomes bankrupt, or takes the benefit of any law relating to insolvent debtors; or

(d) becomes a public contractor or defaulter; or

(e) is attainted of treason, or convicted of felony or infamous crime,

shall no longer retain or continue to be entitled to the
