Act No. 17, 1925.

An Act to amend the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906. [Assented to, 22nd December, 1925.]

B E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Police Regu-Short title lation (Superannuation) Amendment Act, 1925."

#### Police Regulation (Superannuation) Amendment.

Amendment of Act No. 28, 1906, s. 13.

Member otherwise dying.

2. The Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, is amended by omitting section thirteen and by inserting in lieu thereof the following new section:—

13. (1) When any such member has died under circumstances other than those mentioned in the last-preceding section, there may be paid a gratuity not in any case exceeding a sum equal to sixty months' pay of the member at the rate of his salary at the date of his death.

(2) (a) Where the deceased member has served for a period of less than ten years of service the gratuity shall not exceed an amount equal to

one month's pay for each year of service.

(b) Where the deceased member has served for a period of more than ten years of service the gratuity shall not exceed an amount equal to ten months' pay plus two months' pay for each year of service after the tenth year of service.

(3) The gratuity shall be payable in accordance with the direction of the Governor to the widow, mother, or to or on behalf of the

children of the member.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty I assent to this Act.

13. (1) When any such member has died under Member circumstances other than those mentioned in the otherwise dying. last-preceding section, there may be paid a gratuity not in any case exceeding a sum equal to sixty months' pay of the member at the rate of his salary at the date of his death.

(2) (a) Where the deceased member has served for a period of less than ten years of service the gratuity shall not exceed an amount equal to one month's pay for each year of service.

(b) Where the deceased member has served for a period of more than ten years of service the gratuity shall not exceed an amount equal to ten months' pay plus two months' pay for each year of service after the tenth year of service.

(3) The gratuity shall be payable in 20 accordance with the direction of the Governor to the widow, mother, or to or on behalf of the children of the member.
