GEORGII V REGIS.

Act No. 11, 1925.

An Act to enable the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works or any sectional committee thereof to sit and transact business whilst the Legislative Assembly is actually sitting; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 2nd December, 1925.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Works Short title. Committee Act, 1925."

2. The Public Works Act, 1912, is amended by Amendment of Act, 1912, No. 45, s. 17. omitting from section seventeen the following words: "Provided that the Committee shall not nor shall any sectional committee thereof hold any meeting whilst the Legislative Assembly is actually sitting."

I have examined this Bill, and find it to correspond in all respects with the Bill as finally passed by both Houses.

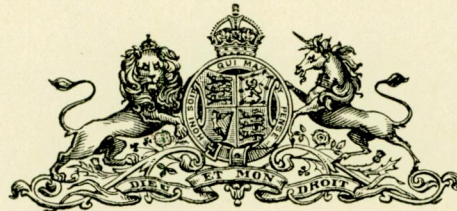

Act No. , 1925.

An Act to enable the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works or any sectional committee thereof to sit and transact business whilst the Legislative Assembly is actually sitting; to amend the Public Works Act, 1912; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Works Short title. Committee Act, 1925."

2. The Public Works Act, 1912, is amended by Amendment of Act, 1912, omitting from section seventeen the following words: No. 45, s. 17.
10 "Provided that the Committee shall not nor shall any sectional committee thereof hold any meeting whilst the Legislative Assembly is actually sitting."
