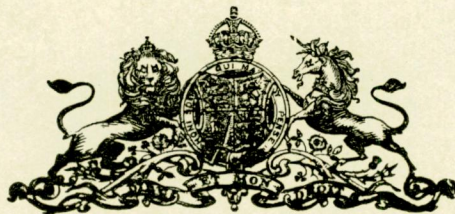

Act No. 9, 1927.

An Act to enable the appointment of an additional judge of the Supreme Court; to amend the Supreme Court and Circuit Courts Act, 1900; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 10th February, 1927.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Supreme Court and Circuit Courts (Amendment) Act, 1927." Short title.

2. The Supreme Court and Circuit Courts Act, 1900, is amended by omitting from subsection one of section nine of the said Act as inserted by the Supreme Court and Circuit Courts (Amendment) Act, 1912, the word "seven" and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "eight." Amendment of Act No. 35, 1900, s. 9 (1).

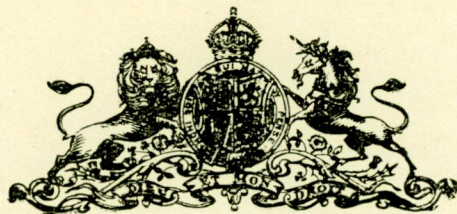

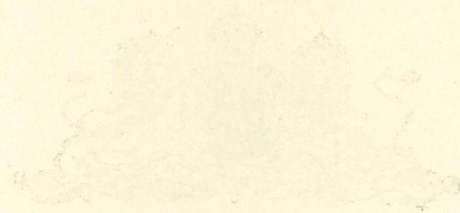
