Day Baking (Amendment) Bill, 1929.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THE objects of the Bill are—

- (1) To permit in districts outside the county of Cumberland or of Northumberland an earlier start on the morning of any Monday or of any day following a holiday.
- (2) To prohibit Sunday baking of bread outside the counties of Cumberland and Northumberland. It is already prohibited within those counties.
- (3) To empower the Minister to grant exemption for a period of not more than two months from the provisions of sections three, four and five of the Act pending the carrying out of any alterations or repairs to a bakehouse or ovens.
- (4) To prohibit the delivery of bread in a locality within which an award controlling or regulating the conditions of employment of breadcarters is binding before the starting time fixed by such award.
- (5) To provide that the period within which a complaint for an offence against the Bread Act, 1901, may be made shall be thirty days.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of 5 the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Day Baking Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1929."

(2) This Act shall be read and construed with the Day Baking Act, 1926.

- 2. The Day Baking Act, 1926, is amended—
 - (a) by omitting from paragraph (c) of section three the words "within the County of Cumberland or of Northumberland";
 - (b) by inserting at the end of section three the 5 following new subsection:—
 - (3) It shall not be an offence within this section to make or bake for sale bread elsewhere than in the County of Cumberland or of Northumberland—

(a) between the hours of four o'clock and half-past five o'clock in the morning of any Monday; or

(b) between the hours of four o'clock and half-past five o'clock in the morning of 15 the day following a day appointed as a holiday in any award or industrial agreement controlling or regulating the conditions of employment of operative bakers;

New s. 5A.

Power of Minister to exempt from certain provisions of this Act. (c) by inserting the following new section next after section five:—

5A. The Minister may, pending the carrying out of any alterations or repairs to a bakehouse or ovens, exempt any person exercising 25 or employed therein in the trade or calling of a baker or pastrycook from the operation of all or any of the provisions of sections three, four, and five of this Act for such period not exceeding two months, and subject to such 30 conditions as the Minister may direct.

(d) by adding at the end of subsection one of section six the following paragraph:—

Any baker or seller of bread or any employee or person acting for or on behalf of a baker or 35 seller of bread who, in a locality within which an award or industrial agreement controlling or regulating the conditions of employment of bread-carters is binding, delivers by vehicle or other

other receptacle any bread to a purchaser before the starting time fixed by such award or industrial agreement, shall be guilty of an offence against this Act.

5 3. The Bread Act, 1901, as amended by subsequent Amendment Acts, is amended by omitting from section eighteen the of Act No. 35, word "seven" and by inserting in lieu thereof the word "thirty."
