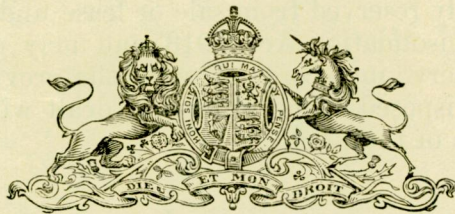

Act No. 26, 1930.

An Act to vest in His Majesty certain land at present forming portion of the Necropolis; to amend the Necropolis Act, 1902, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 23rd June, 1930.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Necropolis (Amendment) Act, 1930."

Necropolis (Amendment).

Vesting and authority to dispose of land under the provisions of the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913.

2. (1) The land described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby vested in His Majesty, and shall from the commencement of this Act be deemed to be Crown lands within the meaning of the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, as amended by subsequent Acts, free from any dedication or trust.

(2) The said land shall be deemed to be exempt from occupation for residence or business purposes under miner's right or business license, and to be temporarily reserved from sale or lease under the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, and may on revocation of the reserve in accordance with the provisions of that Act be disposed of or otherwise dealt with under the provisions of that Act.

SCHEDULE.

ALL that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Liberty Plains, county of Cumberland, containing an area of about 39½ acres, bounded by Arthur-street, Sir Thomas Mitchell road, and the Flemington to Campsie railway line, exclusive of a strip 1 chain wide extending from Arthur-street to an overbridge on the Flemington to Campsie railway line aforesaid, used as a road and vested in fee simple in the Railway Commissioners for New South Wales, and of a strip 1 chain wide carrying pipe for water supply to Northern Suburbs.

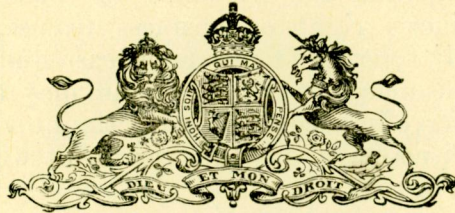
