Act No. 22, 1928.

An Act to sanction the construction of nurses' quarters at the Royal North Shore Hospital of Sydney; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 16th June, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Royal North Shore Hospital of Sydney (Nurses' Accommodation) Act, 1928." Short title.

2. The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is hereby empowered to carry out the same.

The plan.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked "Royal North Shore Hospital—Nurses' Quarters," signed by the Secretary for Public Works and countersigned by the Government Architect, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost.

4. The cost of carrying out the work is estimated at sixty-seven thousand two hundred and eighty-four pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

The construction of a building of simple design in brick, four storeys in height, with accommodation for 134 nurses and 26 maids. The building will be of fireproof construction throughout, and provision will be made in the foundation work for carrying it up a further two storeys when the necessity arises, subject to such modifications as the Constructing Authority may think desirable.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty I assent to this Act.
