Act No. 39, 1928.

An Act to repeal the Special Deposits Accounts Act, 1911; to transfer certain balances at credit of special deposits accounts opened in the Treasury under that Act to the Consolidated Revenue Fund; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 18th December, 1928.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Special Deposits Accounts Act, 1911, Repeal Act, 1928."

Short title and commencement.

(2) This Act shall be deemed to commence on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight.

(1) The balance to the credit, at the commencement of this Act, of any special deposit account opened under the Act hereby repealed and in existence upon the date of the signification of His Majesty's assent to this Act shall be transferred by the Colonial Treasurer to the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

(2) Nothing in this Act shall invalidate any payments lawfully made into or out of any such Special Deposit Account since the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, and before the signification of His Majesty's assent to this Act, and the same shall respectively be deemed to be payments lawfully made into and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund.

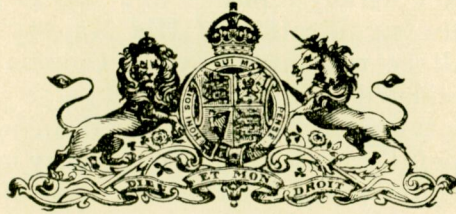

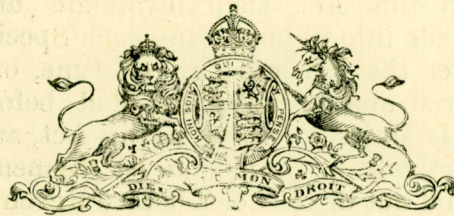

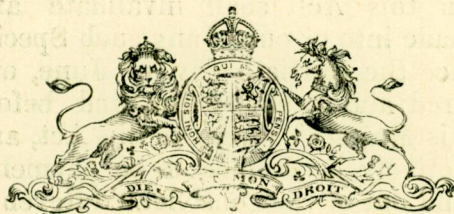
