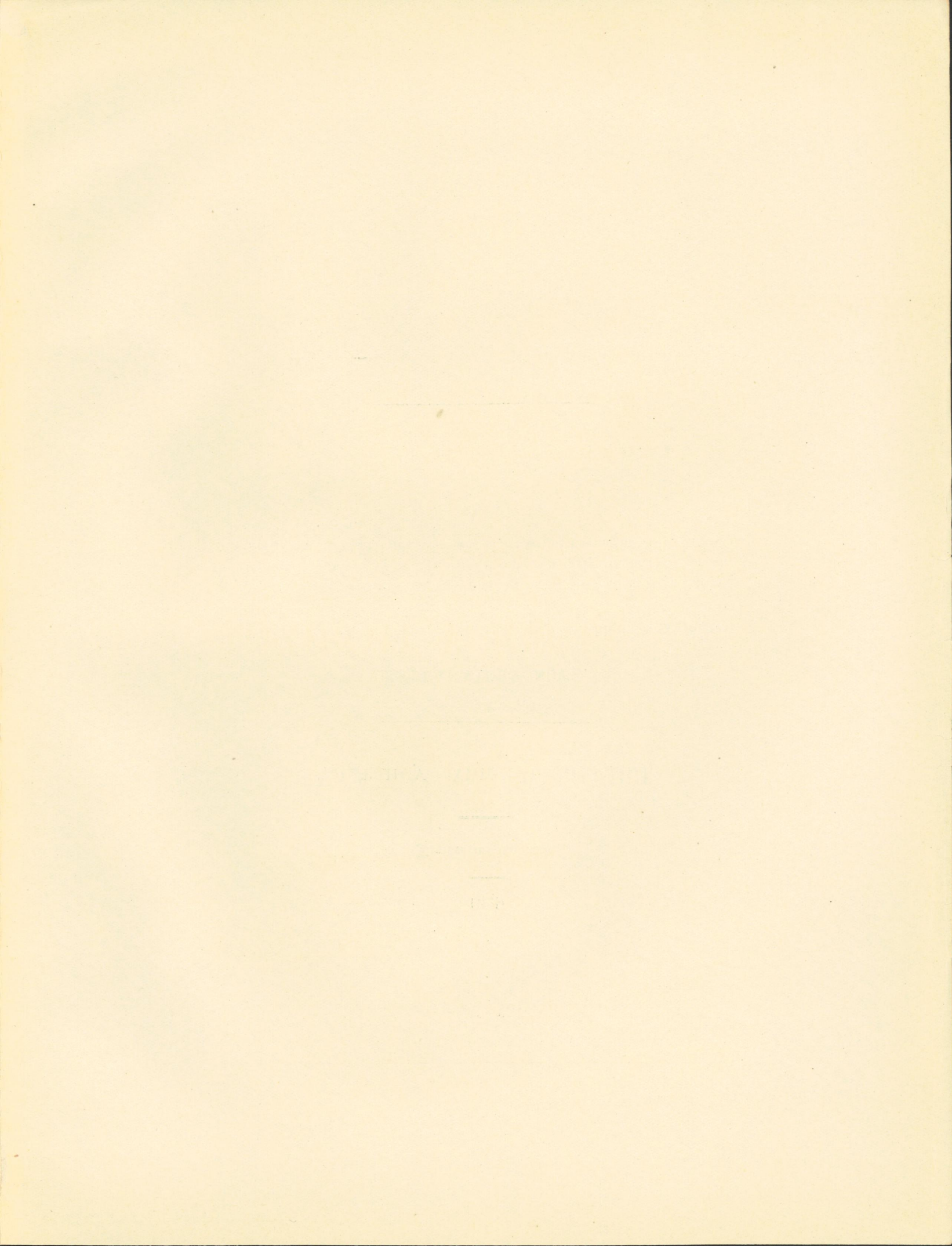

Vagrancy (Amendment) Bill.

EXPLANATORY NOTE.

THIS Bill is destined to give greater powers to deal with the consorting of criminals.

Section 4, subsection (1) of the Act is amended by making it an offence for any person to habitually consort with reputed criminals or known prostitutes or persons who have been convicted of having no visible lawful means of support.

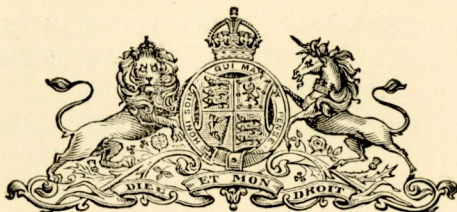
