An Act to make certain provisions relating to officers and servants of the Australian Museum; to amend the Australian Museum Act, 1902, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Australian Museum (Amendment) Act, 1931," and shall be read with the Australian Museum Act, 1902.
