A BILL

To abolish the Legislative Council; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

[MR. WILLIS ;—2 *December*, 1930.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution Further Amendment (Legislative Council Abolition) Act, 1930," and shall be read with the Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts. Short title.

2. (1) The Legislative Council of New South Wales is abolished.

(2) The seat of every Member of the said Legislative Council shall, on and after the commencement of this Act, be vacant; and the office of Member of the said Legislative Council is abolished. 5

(3) All offices constituted or created in or in connection with the said Legislative Council are abolished and all appropriations in respect thereof are repealed. 10

(4) Any reference in any Act, ordinance, rule, regulation, instrument, or writing whatsoever to the Legislature or to the Parliament or to both Houses of Parliament or of the Legislature or to each House of Parliament or to either House of Parliament or other reference which if this Act had not been passed would be deemed to include a reference to the Legislative Council, shall be construed to refer only to His Majesty the King with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales or only to the said Legislative Assembly as the context may require. 20
