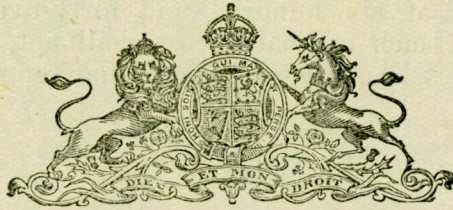

Act No. 6, 1931.

An Act to sanction the construction of works of stormwater drainage in the Throsby Creek Drainage Area, Newcastle; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 16th February, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Throsby Creek Stormwater Drainage Act, 1931." Short title.

2. (1) The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule is hereby sanctioned, and the Minister for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works. Works sanctioned.

(2) The plan of the said works is the plan marked "Throsby Creek Stormwater Drainage, Newcastle," signed by the Minister for Public Works and counter-signed by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply and Sewerage, and deposited in the office of the said Minister.

Cost.

(3) The cost of carrying out the said works is estimated at six hundred and forty-five thousand pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

THE deepening and enlarging of the existing Throsby Creek entrance and channel, and the construction of submains and branches, with necessary bridge crossings. The work will consist of concrete-lined channels with reinforced concrete pipes for the smaller laterals, making a total length of about twenty-six miles.

Subject to such deviations and modifications as may be deemed necessary by the Minister.

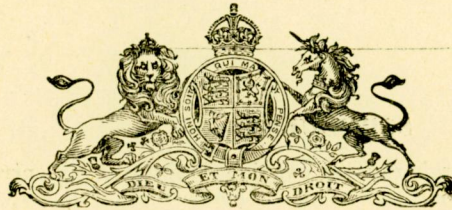
