An Act to vest in the Trustees of the Anzac Memorial Building the sole right to publish replicas, photographs, booklets, pamphlets and other like matter relating to the Anzac Memorial Building; to make further provision as to the care, control and management of the Anzac Memorial Building; to validate matters; to amend the Anzac certain Memorial (Building) Act, 1923; and for purposes connected therewith. 




