An Act to vest in the Trustees of the Anzac Memorial Building the sole right to publish replicas, photographs, booklets, pamphlets and other like matter relating to the Anzac Memorial Building; to make further provision as to the care, control and management of the Anzac Memorial Building; to validate certain matters; to amend the Anzac Memorial (Building) Act, 1923; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 9th November, 1934.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Anzac Memorial (Building) Amendment Act, 1934." Short title.

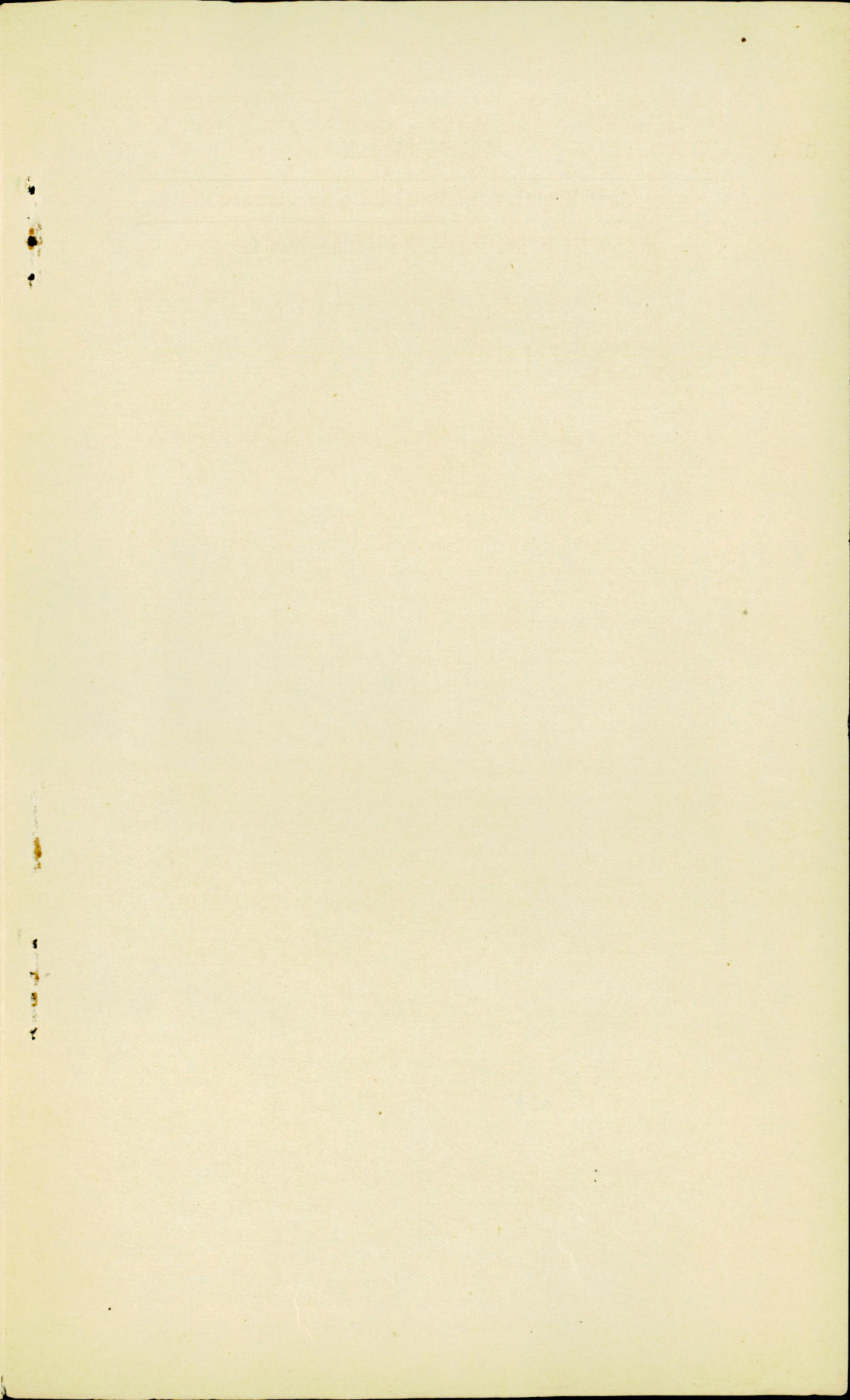

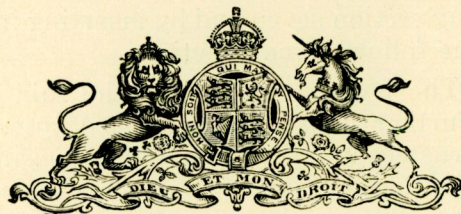
